Misophonia is a common condition where a person experiences a specific innocuous stimulus (e.g. chewing sound) and has an extreme response (e.g. anger/disgust). Prevalence of misophonia is 10-15% in adults, and median age of onset is 8-11 years. Misophonia is not in the DSM or ICD.

This class is for clinicians, teachers, counselors, and others who work in a public service capacity. It will teach the unique characteristics of misophonia to help you distinguish it from other anxiety, anger, behavioral, compulsive, and sensory conditions.
